Literacy	In grades 1-5, all students at or above grade level benchmark will maintain growth and 85% of students below benchmark will make 1.5 year's growth as demonstrated on independent reading running records. 85% of Kindergarten students will attain grade level benchmarks as measured by the Foundational Assessment by the end of the 2022-2023 school year.	
Math	All students in K-5 will demonstrate growth from Number Corner Checkup 1 as measured with the number corner assessments. 90% of students approaching grade level standards will move into meeting by the end of the 2022-2023 school year as measured by the end of year Number Corner Assessment.	
Engagement/Culture	When we Welcome, Honor, and Connect with families, Student - We will see a 15% increase in the number of students who feel they are supported and respected in their school and classroom at the end of the 2022-23 school year as measured by the Keller End of Year Climate and Culture Survey. Family - 100% of Parents/Guardians/Families will engage in the learning process with their children by attending Parent/Teacher Conferences, communicating regularly with teachers, or attending Engagement Nights, and 5 parents will participate as members of the Family Engagement Committee.

High Priority Strategies/Action Steps	
	Literacy : Teachers will apply Literacy Learning and use their Collaborative Learning Teams (CLT) to identify and track students needing support. Plans for universal or tier 1 intervention will be developed and implemented. Students who do not make sufficient progress will be referred to a Learning Support Team (LST) for tier 2 interventions.
	Math : Using math assessment data combined with observational data, teachers will work in their CLT to develop tier 1 intervention strategies, monitor student progress and refer students to LST if necessary for tier 2 interventions.
	Engagement: Family Engagement will be fostered through intentional invitations by staff to be involved in planning of events, giving feedback on goals and progress towards goals. Keller Staff will help Students develop strong relationships and provide opportunities for students to feel like they are an important member of the class as well as being connected within the school community.
